Try to avoid tying things on the outside. ▪ Walking Boots are important. They must be waterproof, have a good tread, and provide ankle support. Leather walking boots are needed when you use an axe or saw – for example when collecting and preparing wood for the fire. ▪ Electronic items, e.g. iPod, MP3, mobile phones are not allowed. If any are taken it is at your own risk. ▪ Please label all bags and items with your child's name. ▪ Pack a sun hat and sun cream. We are outside all the time, so if it is sunny it is essential. Make sure you son or daughter knows how to apply it, and when they should apply it. ▪ If your son or daughter has long hair, please send them with a few spare hair bobbles to tie their hair back. This is for when cooking so that hair does not dangle in the fire or on the stove and potentially catch fire. ▪ The number of t-shirts, shorts and trousers etc are up to you, but make sure they have some spare in case they get really mucky or wet. ▪ A bin bag or old pillowcase is a useful addition for storing dirty clothes. (pillowcases allow the clothes to 'breathe'!)
